

# Friendship Card



## Supplies:

**All Supplies are Stampin' Up! unless otherwise noted.**

- **Stamps:** Friends 24-7
- **Ink:** Basic Black Classic ink, Certainly Celery Classic ink, Old Olive Classic ink, Pretty in Pink Classic ink, Regal Rose Classic ink
- **Paper:** Whisper White CS, Basic Black CS
- **Accessories:** Snail adhesive, bone folder, Scallop Trim Border punch, blender pen, Sherbet buttons, 5/8" Old Olive Satin Ribbon, mini glue dots; **Non-SU:** white button twine

## Directions:

1. Take a 4 1/4" x 11" piece of Whisper White CS and fold it in half using your bone folder to create a 4 1/4" x 5 1/2" card.
2. Take a 1 1/2" x 4 1/4" piece of Basic Black CS and scallop one 4 1/4" edge using the Scallop Trim border punch.
3. Keeping your Old Olive Satin ribbon on the roll, stick one end of the ribbon to the back of the left edge of the Basic Black scalloped border.
4. Pleat the ribbon all along the Basic Black CS piece, using Snail adhesive to hold the pleats in place. When your last pleat is about 1 1/4" away from the right edge of the CS, cut the ribbon making sure to leave about 1" of ribbon overhanging the right edge of the CS. Bring the ribbon end around to the back of the CS and stick it down using Snail adhesive.
5. Take a large pink button and thread about 8" of button twine up through the holes, and then tie it in a bow.
6. Stick the button to the Old Olive Satin ribbon with a couple of mini glue dots. Set the border aside for a moment.
7. Using Basic Black Classic ink, stamp the flower image about 1 1/4" away from the right edge of the Whisper White card front, and about 1 1/4" up from the bottom edge of the card.
8. Stamp the greeting towards the right of the card, about 1 3/4" up from the bottom edge of the card.
9. Color in the leaves and stems of the flower using Certainly Celery and Old Olive Classic ink. Color in the flowers using Pretty in Pink and Regal Rose Classic inks.
10. Using Snail adhesive stick the Basic Black CS border with Old Olive ribbon onto the card front so that it covers the bottom of the flower stem and is just below the bottom edge of the greeting. You're done!
