

Sweet Card



Supplies:

All Supplies are Stampin' Up! unless otherwise noted.

- **Stamps:** Sweet Scoops
- **Ink:** Creamy Caramel Classic ink, Pretty in Pink Classic ink, Regal Rose Classic ink
- **Paper:** Pixie Pink textured CS, Pumpkin Pie CS, Whisper White CS, Petal Party Simply Scrappin' Kit
- **Accessories:** Stampin' Dimensionals, bone folder, Linen Thread, paper snips, Scallop Trim Border punch, Sherbet buttons, Snail adhesive, VersaMark pad, Iridescent Ice embossing powder, heat tool, mini glue dots; **Non-SU:** foam sticker letters

Directions:

1. Take your 12" x 12" sheet of textured Pixie Pink CS and cut a 4 ¼" x 12" strip. Trim this strip so that it is 4 ¼" x 11". Fold it in half with a bone folder to create a 4 ¼" x 5 ½" card.
2. Scallop one 4 ½" side of a 3 ½" x 4 ½" piece of Pumpkin Pie CS with the Scallop trim border punch.
3. Take a 2" x 3 ½" piece of striped DP from the Petal Party Collection and carefully tear along the bottom. To tear, hold the paper so that the stripes are facing upwards. Hold the paper in your left hand and then carefully tear towards you with your right hand. You can use the thumb on your left hand (the hand holding the paper) to help guide your tear line.
4. Stick a 2 ¾" x 3 ½" piece of polka dot DP to the bottom of the scalloped Pumpkin Pie CS using Snail adhesive. Leave about a ½" of the Pumpkin Pie CS showing.
5. Align the straight edge of the striped DP with the top edge of the polka dot DP and stick it down using Snail adhesive.
6. Take an 18" piece of linen thread and wrap it twice around the Pumpkin Pie CS – you want the ends to be towards the left side of the CS.
7. Thread the ends up through the holes of your button and tie them in a bow. Trim the ends if necessary.
8. Place a couple of mini glue dots beneath the button to stick it to the CS so that it does not flop around.
9. Center and stick the DP to the card front with Stampin' Dimensionals.
10. Stamp an ice cream cone onto a scrap of Whisper White CS in Creamy Caramel Classic ink and cut it out using paper snips.
11. Ink up the ice cream stamp in Pretty in Pink Classic ink, and the textured line stamp in Regal Rose Classic ink. Stamp the ice cream stamp directly onto the textured line stamp. Now huff on the stamp and stamp it onto a scrap of Whisper White CS.
12. Pat a VersaMark pad onto the ice cream and then sprinkle on Iridescent Ice embossing powder. Heat it with a heat tool to melt the embossing powder.
13. Stick the foam sticker letters along the bottom of the polka dot DP. Instead of foam sticker letters you could die cut the letters out of white fun foam using your Big Shot and Timeless Type Junior Alphabet die.
14. Slide the ice cream cone a little underneath the letter "t" and stick it down with Snail adhesive.
15. Stick the ice cream to the cone with a Stampin' Dimensional. You're done!
